Brief history of the First Five Saturdays devotion

In the July 13, 1917 apparition to the children of Fatima, Our Lady said that God wanted to establish worldwide devotion to her Immaculate Heart, in order to save many souls and to bring peace. She told the children that she would return at a future time to ask for the "Communion of Reparation on the First Saturdays."

Several years later, Our Lady did return, but by that time Francisco and Jacinta had died. She visited Lucia in her convent on Dec 10, 1925 – and she appeared holding her Immaculate Heart in her hand, with the Child Jesus standing beside her in a cloud of light!

Jesus said, "Have compassion on the Heart of your most holy mother, covered with thorns, with which ungrateful men pierce it at every moment, and there is no one to make an act of reparation to remove them."

Then, the Blessed Virgin Mary explained a way for people to make reparation and to remove those painful thorns from around her heart!

This way is called the "Five First Saturdays Devotion."

The Blessed Virgin Mary said she would "assist at the hour of death, with the graces necessary for salvation," all those who fulfilled the Five First Saturdays Devotion.

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An Examination of Conscience based on the Ten Commandments

To make an examination ahead of seeking forgiveness from God:

- Set aside some quiet time for reflection.
- Start by praying to the Holy Spirit, asking for help in making a good examination to prepare for Confession.
- Read through the items on this list and honestly reflect on your behavior for each item.

First Commandment:

I am the LORD your God. You shall worship the Lord your God and Him only shall you serve.

Have I...

- Disobeyed the commandments of God or the Church?
- Refused to accept what God has revealed as true, or what the Catholic Church proposes for belief?
- Denied the existence of God?
- Nourished and protected my faith?
- Rejected everything opposed to a sound faith?

- Deliberately misled others about doctrine or the faith?
- Rejected the Catholic faith, joined another Christian denomination, or joined or practiced another religion?
- Joined a group forbidden to Catholics (Masons, communists, etc.)?
- Despaired about my salvation or the forgiveness of my sins?
- Presumed on God's mercy?
 (Committing a sin in expectation of forgiveness, or asking for forgiveness without conversion and practicing virtue.)

- Loved someone or something more than God (money, power, sex, ambition, etc.)?
- Let someone or something influence my choices more than God?
- Engaged in superstitious practices?
 (Incl. horoscopes, fortune tellers, etc.)
- Been involved in the occult? (Séances, Ouija board, worship of Satan, etc.) Formally left the Catholic Church?
- Hidden a serious sin or told a lie in confession?

Second Commandment:

You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain.

Have I...

- Used the name of God in cursing or blasphemy?
- Failed to keep vows or promises that I have made to God?
- Spoken about the Faith, the Church, the saints, or sacred things with irreverence, hatred or defiance?
- Watched television or movies, or listened to music that treated God,

the Church, the saints, or sacred things irreverently?

- Used vulgar, suggestive or obscene speech?
- Belittled others in my speech?
- Behaved disrespectfully in Church?
- Misused places or things set apart for the worship of God?
- Committed perjury? (Breaking an oath or lying under oath.)
- Blamed God for my failings?

Third Commandment:

Remember to keep holy the Sabbath day.

Have I...

- Set time aside each day for personal prayer to God?
- Missed Mass on Sunday or Holy Days (through own fault w/o sufficient reason)?
- Committed a sacrilege against the Blessed Sacrament?
- Received a sacrament while in the state of mortal sin?

- Habitually come late to and/or leave early from Mass without a good reason?
- Shop, labor, or do business unnecessarily on Sunday or other Holy Days of Obligation?
- Not attend to taking my children to Mass?
- Knowingly eat meat on a forbidden day (or not fasting on a fast day)?
- Eat or drink within one hour of receiving Communion (other than medical need)?

Fourth Commandment:

Honour your father and your mother.

Have I...

- (If still under my parents' care)
 Obeyed all that my parents reasonably asked of me?
- Neglected the needs of my parents in their old age or in their time of need?
- (If still in school) Obeyed the reasonable demands of my teachers?
- Neglected to give my children proper food, clothing, shelter,

- education, discipline and care (even after Confirmation)?
- Provided for the religious education and formation of my children for as long as they are under my care?
- Ensured that my children still under my care regularly frequent the sacraments of Penance and Holy Communion?
- Educated my children in a way that corresponds to my religious convictions?
- Provided my children with a positive, prudent and personalized education in the Catholic teaching on human sexuality?

- Been to my children a good example of how to live the Catholic Faith?
- Prayed with and for my children?
- Lived in humble obedience to those who legitimately exercise authority over me?
- Have I broken the law?
- Have I supported or voted for a politician whose positions are opposed to the teachings of Christ and the Catholic Church?

Fifth Commandment:

You shall not kill.

- Unjustly threatened another person with bodily harm?
- Verbally or emotionally abused another person?
- Hated another person, or wished him evil?
- Been prejudiced, or unjustly discriminated against others because of their race, colour, nationality, sex or religion?
- Joined a hate group?
- Purposely provoked another by teasing or nagging?

- Recklessly endangered my life or health, or that of another, by my actions?
- Driven recklessly or under the influence of alcohol or other drugs?
- Sold or given drugs to others to use for non-therapeutic purposes?
- Used tobacco immoderately?Abused alcohol or other drugs?
- Over-eaten?
- Encouraged others to sin by giving scandal?
- Helped another to commit a mortal sin (through advice, driving them somewhere, etc.?

- Caused serious injury or death by criminal neglect?
- Indulged in serious anger? Refused to control my temper?
- Been mean to, quarrelled with, or wilfully hurt someone?
- Been unforgiving to others, when mercy or pardon was requested?
- Sought revenge or hoped something bad would happen to someone?
- Delighted to see someone else get hurt or suffer?
- Treated animals cruelly, causing them to suffer or die needlessly?

Sixth & Ninth Commandments:

You shall not commit adultery.
You shall not covet your neighbour's
wife.

Have I...

- Practiced the virtue of chastity?
- Given in to lust? (The desire for sexual pleasure unrelated to spousal love in marriage.)
- Used an artificial means of birth control?
- Refused to be open to conception, without just cause? (Catechism, 2368)

- Participated in immoral techniques for in vitro fertilization or artificial insemination?
- Sterilized my sex organs for contraceptive purposes?
- Deprived my spouse of the marital right, without just cause?
- Claimed my own marital right without concern for my spouse?
- Deliberately caused male climax outside of normal sexual intercourse? (Catechism, 2366)
- Wilfully entertained impure thoughts?

- Purchased, viewed, or made use of pornography?
- Watched movies and television that involve sex and nudity?
- Listened to music or jokes that are harmful to purity?
- Committed adultery? (Sexual relations with someone who is married, or with someone other than my spouse.)
- Committed incest? (Sexual relations with a relative or in-law.)
- Committed fornication? (Sexual relations with someone of the opposite sex when neither of us is married.)

- Engaged in homosexual activity?
 (Sexual activity with someone of the same sex.)
- Committed rape?
- Masturbated? (Deliberate stimulation of one's own sexual organs for sexual pleasure.)
- Engaged in sexual foreplay (petting) reserved for marriage?
- Preyed upon children or youth for my sexual pleasure?
- Engaged in unnatural sexual activities?
- Engaged in prostitution, or paid for the services of a prostitute?

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Examine of Conscience based on the Be-attitudes

To make an examination ahead of seeking forgiveness from God:

- Set aside some quiet time for reflection.
- Start by praying to the Holy Spirit, asking for help in making a good examination to prepare for Confession.
- Read through the items on this list and honestly reflect on your behavior for each item.

Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

- Do I truly love God above all things?
- Am I humble enough to acknowledge my total dependence on God?
- Can I admit mistakes without blaming others?
- Do I take the time for God in my life through personal and private prayer?
- Do I refer my choices and decisions to God on a regular basis?
- Do I talk to God about how to spend my time?

- Have I grown slack in prayer?
- Do I attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation? Is Mass a priority?
- Do I take the Lord's name in vain?
 Do I use His name casually in everyday conversation or do I honour His name when I speak?
- Have I done my best to be emptied of sin and worldly desires so that God may fill it with His love?
- Do I strive with my time, passion, and resources – to accumulate more temporal/earthly/material goods and honours, rather than seeking to obtain true spiritual goods?

- When I pray, do I only ask God for things, instead of for a closer relationship with Him?
- Do I desire more money or a higher place in life?

Blessed are they who mourn, for they will be comforted.

- Has my heart become hardened to the circumstances of others?
- Do I let the pain and suffering of other people affect me, or is it that I just choose to ignore it?
- Do I console and help those who mourn and suffer? Am I willing to

- admit my own pain, brokenness and be open with others?
- When was the last time I really repented for my sin, or asked someone to forgive me whom I hurt?
- Have I been able to say 'I am sorry' and really mean it?
- Do I experience genuine sorrow over the sins committed by myself and others? Do I consider how much they offend God and how they bring more evil and disorder into the world?
- Do I do sufficient penance for my own sins, and offer my little

sufferings and crosses to God for reparation of the sins of others?

Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the land.

- Am I willing to suffer quietly in faith as Jesus did, or do I tend to complain and argue about every wrong thing (real or, sometimes it is my own imagination) done to me?
- Do I humbly regard others as more important than myself?
- Have I sacrificed myself for the good of another person?

- Do I try to bully and manipulate, or intimidate other people to do what I want?
- Am I obstinate and quarrelsome, always trying to insist on my will over that of others, in regard to petty and unimportant things?

- Do I give thanks and praise to God as Creator of all things?
- Do I desire to be holy?
- How much of a priority is it to love and follow Jesus Christ in my life? Honestly.

- Have I let fear keep me silent when I should have spoken out?
- Do I consider how my personal decisions may negatively affect others in my family or community?
- Do I listen with attention and devotion to the Word of God proclaimed?
- Do I hunger for the Eucharist?
- Do I offer my trials to God for the salvation of souls?

Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy.

- Am I quick to forgive others? Do I harbour resentment or hold grudges?
- Are there people in my life who are suffering because of my lack of forgiveness?
- Am I quick to judge others?
- Do I give them the benefit of the doubt?
- Do I speak with love/gently to others or am I harsh and pushy?
- Am I happy when someone else fails or "gets what they deserve?"

- Do the needs of others come before my own?
- Do I forgive myself for my own shortcomings?
- Do I give in to hopelessness?
- Do I accept God's mercy?
- Have I been convicted that I can't earn my way into heaven and that eternal life comes through God's mercy toward me?

Blessed are the clean of heart, for they will see God.

- Do I lie or cheat?
- Do I gossip or enjoy sharing stories about others?
- Am I lustful? Have I led others to lust and impurity by the way I dress, through conversations, or other means?
- Do I view pornography?
- Do I see others simply as objects of sexual desire?
- Am I faithful to my spouse?
- Do I abuse my spouse or children through words or actions?

- Have I hurt another person? Have I damaged their reputation or good name?
- Have I stolen from someone?
- Have I withheld wages or acted dishonestly?
- Am I honest about my own faults and failings?
- Do I do what is truly right or do I compromise especially when it is convenient for me to do so?
- Have I allowed a particular sin or vice to distract me from God?
- Do I look for instant gratification?

Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.

- Do I make reconciliation with God and others a priority?
- Do I try to make real peace with others in my family? At work? In my parish & community?
- Do I pray for peace throughout the world? Do I like to cause conflict or do I try to resolve it?
- Do I start a lot of fights in my home by not trying to understand the other person's point of view? What about my workplace and community?

Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

- Do I believe the teachings of the Church? Am I willing to stand up for those beliefs?
- Am I guided by what the Church teaches me even when it is hard or unpopular, or difficult to do so?
- Am I a Christian only when it is convenient for me or socially acceptable? Am I a Christian only so long as it increases my popularity?
- Am I able to suffer in silence or am I always complaining?

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Confession: A "How To" Guide

Forgotten how to go to confession, or never learned? Here are the "How to's" for the Sacrament of Penance (i.e., confession).

Penitent: the person confessing his sins.

Confessor: the Priest administering the Sacrament.

1.The Penitent enters the confessional and kneels.. The Penitent, making the sign of the cross, says, "Bless me, Father, for I have sinned. It has been _____ (state amount of time) since my last confession. These are my sins.

- 2. The Penitent confesses his sins. The Confessor listens, but he may ask questions if something the Penitent has said is unclear or in order to lead the Penitent to a more thorough examination of conscience. (NB. All mortal sins each kind and the number of times committed must be confessed. All venial sins should be confessed.)
- 3. When the Penitent finishes confessing, he signifies this by saying: For these and all my sins, I ask forgiveness of God and absolution from you, Father. The Confessor may offer some advice or counsel, so that the Penitent may

take the necessary steps to amend his life.

- 4. The Confessor then gives a penance (usually a prayer or a good work) and then instructs the Penitent to make an Act of Contrition (see end of this section).
- 5. After the Penitent has made an Act of Contrition, the Confessor imparts absolution with the sacramental formula. The Penitent makes the Sign of the Cross at the absolution.
- 6.The Confessor concludes with these or similar words: Your sins are forgiven. Go in peace.

- 7. The Penitent responds, saying: Thanks be to God.
- 8. The Penitent leaves the confessional and fulfills the penance as soon as possible.

The Act of Contrition

My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart. In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good, I have sinned against you whom I should love above all things. I firmly intend, with your help, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me to sin. Our Savior

Jesus Christ suffered and died for us. In his name, my God, have mercy.

Lord, grant me the grace of poverty of spirit

Our Father...

- 8. "I come to proclaim good news to you tidings of great joy. This day in David's city a savior has been born to you, The Messiah and Lord." (Lk. 2: 10-11) Hail Mary...
- 9. Suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying: "Glory to God in high heaven, peace on earth to those on

whom His favor rests." (Lk. 2: 13-14) - Hail Mary...

10. They went in haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby lying in the manger; once they saw, they understood what had been told them concerning this child. (Lk. 2: 16-17) - Hail Mary...

- 7. "The hour is on us when the Son of Man is to be handed over to the power of evil men." (Mt. 26:45) Hail Mary...
- 8. While he was still speaking, Judas, one of the twelve, arrived accompanied by a great crowd with swords and clubs. (Mt. 26: 47) Hail Mary...
- 9. He immediately went over to Jesus, said to him, "Peace, Rabbi," and

embraced him. (Mt. 26: 49) - Hail Mary...

10. Jesus answered, "Friend, do what you are here for."At that moment they stepped forward to lay hand on Jesus and arrest Him. (Mt. 26: 50) - Hail Mary...

- 2. Jesus answered, "My Kingdom does not belong to this world"...At this, Pilate said to him, "So then you are a king?" Jesus replied, "It is you who say I am a king. The reason I was born, the reason why I came into the world is to testify to the truth. Anyone committed to the truth, hears my voice." (Jn. 18:36-37) Hail Mary...
- 3. This much only will I say, "From now on, the Son of Man will have his seat at the right hand of the Power of God." (Lk. 22: 69) Hail Mary...
- 4. "So you are the Son of God?" they asked in chorus. He answered, "It is you

- who say that I am." (Lk. 22: 70) Hail Mary...
- 5. Pilate's next move was to take Jesus and have him scourged. (Jn. 19:1) Hail Mary...
- 6. Despised and rejected by men, a man of sorrows. (Is. 53: 3) Hail Mary...
- 7. And yet, ours were the sufferings he bore. (Is. 53: 4) Hail Mary...
- 8. He was pierced through for our faults, crushed for our sins. (Is. 53: 5) Hail Mary...

- 9. They blindfolded him first, slapped him and then taunted him. (Lk. 22: 64) Hail Mary...
- 10. And after he had Jesus scourged, Pilate handed him over to be crucified. (Mk. 15: 15) Hail Mary...

THE THIRD SORROWFUL MYSTERY

THE CROWNING WITH THORNS

Lord, grant me the grace to be in the world, but not of it

- 1. The soldiers now led Jesus away into the hall known as the Praetorium; at the time they assembled the whole cohort. (Mk. 15: 16) Hail Mary...
- 2. They dressed him in royal purple, then wove a crown of thorns and put it on him. (Mk. 15: 17) Hail Mary...

- 3. They began to salute him, All hail! King of the Jews! (Mk. 15: 18) Hail Mary...
- 4. Continually striking Jesus on the head with a reed and spitting at him, they genuflected before him and pretended to pay him homage. (Mk. 15: 19) Hail Mary...
- 5. Pilate said to the crowd: "Observe what I do. I am going to bring him out to you to make you realize that I find no case against him." (Jn. 19: 4) Hail Mary...

- 6. When Jesus came out wearing the crown of thorns and the purple cloak, Pilate said to them, "Look at the man!" (John 19: 5) Hail Mary...
- 7. As soon as the chief priests and the temple guards saw him they shouted, "Crucify him! Crucify him!" (Jn. 19: 6) Hail Mary...
- 8. "Why, what crime has he committed?" asked Pilate. They only shouted louder, "Crucify him!" (Mk. 15: 14) Hail Mary...
- 9. Pilate said to the Jews, "Look at your king!" (Jn. 19: 14) Hail Mary...

10. In the end, Pilate handed Jesus over to be crucified. (Jn. 19: 16) - Hail Mary...

JESUS CARRIES THE CROSS

- 2. On their way out they met a Cyrenian named Simon. This man they pressed

- into service to carry the cross. (Mt. 27: 32) Hail Mary...
- 3. A great crowd of people followed him, including women who beat their breasts and lamented over him. (Lk. 23: 27) Hail Mary...
- 4. Jesus turned to them and said: "Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me. Weep for yourselves and for your children." (Lk. 23: 28) Hail Mary...
- 5. Two others who were criminals were led along with him to be crucified. (Lk. 23: 32) Hail Mary...

- 6. Upon arriving at the site called Golgotha, (a name which means Skull Place), they gave him a drink of wine flavored with gall, which he tasted but refused to drink. (Mt. 27: 33-34) Hail Mary...
- 7. When they had crucified him, they divided his clothes among them by casting lots; then they sat down there and kept watch over him. (Mt. 27: 35-36) Hail Mary...
- 8. "Whoever wishes to be my follower must deny his very self." (Lk. 9: 23) Hail Mary...

- 9. "He must take up his cross every day and follow in my steps." (Lk. 9: 23) Hail Mary...
- 10. "Whoever would save his life will lose it, whoever loses his life for my sake, will save it." (Lk. 9: 24) Hail Mary...

THE FIFTH SORROWFUL MYSTERY

THE CRUCIFIXION

Lord, grant me the grace of pardoning of injuries

- 1. Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, they do not know what they are doing." (Lk. 23: 32) Hail Mary...
- 2. One of the criminals said: "Jesus, remember me when you enter upon your reign." And Jesus replied, "I assure you; this day you will be with me in paradise." (Lk. 23: 42-43) Hail Mary...

- 3. Seeing his mother there with the disciple whom he loved, Jesus said to his mother, "Woman, there is your son." (Jn. 19: 26) Hail Mary...
- 4. In turn he said to the disciple, "There is your Mother." From that hour onward, the disciple took her into his care. (Jn. 19: 27) Hail Mary...
- 5. Then toward mid-afternoon, Jesus cried out in a loud tone, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" (Mt. 27: 46) Hail Mary...
- 6. Jesus realizing that everything was now finished, said to fulfill the

Scriptures, "I am thirsty." There was a jar there, full of common wine. They stuck a sponge soaked in this wine on a stick, and raised it to his lips. (Jn. 19: 28) - Hail Mary...

- 7. When Jesus took the wine, He said, "Now it is finished." (Jn. 19: 30) Hail Mary...
- 8. Jesus uttered a loud cry and said, "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit." After he said this, he expired. (Lk. 23: 46) Hail Mary...
- 9. Darkness came over the whole land until midafternoon with an eclipse of

the sun. The curtain in the sanctuary was torn in two. (Lk. 23: 44-45) - Hail Mary...

10. They took Jesus' body, and in accordance with Jewish burial custom, bound it up in wrappings of cloth with perfumed oils. (Jn. 19: 40) - Hail Mary...

- 8. At the sight of the Lord, the disciples rejoiced. (Jn. 20:20) Hail Mary...
- 9. "Peace be with you." Jesus said again. "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." (Jn. 20:21) Hail Mary...

10. "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, though he should die, will come to life." (Jn. 11:25-26) - Hail Mary...

- 6. As Jesus blessed them, he left them and was taken up to heaven. (Lk. 24:51)

- 7. He was lifted up before their eyes in a cloud which took him from their sight. (Acts. 1:9) Hail Mary...
- 8. "This Jesus who has been taken from you will return, just as you saw him go up to the heavens." (Acts. 1:11)
 Hail Mary...
- 9. They fell down to do him reverence, then returned to Jerusalem filled with joy. (Lk. 24:52) Hail Mary...
- 10. Jesus took his seat at God's right hand. (Mk. 16:19) Hail Mary...

THE THIRD GLORIOUS MYSTERY

THE DESCENT OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

Lord, grant me the grace of all gifts from the Holy Spirit

- 1. Jesus said, "I will ask the Father and he will give you another Paraclete, to be with you always." (Jn. 14:16) Hail Mary...
- 2. "The Paraclete, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will instruct you in everything, and

remind you of all that I told you." (Jn. 14:26) - Hail Mary...

- 3. "Within a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit." (Acts. 1:5) Hail Mary...
- 4. "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes down on you; then you are to be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea....and even to the ends of the earth." (Acts. 1:8) Hail Mary...
- 5. When the day of Pentecost came it found them gathered in one place. Suddenly from up in the sky there came

a noise like a strong driving wind, which was heard all through the house. (Acts. 2:1-2) - Hail Mary...

- 6. Tongues as of fire appeared, which parted and came to rest on each of them. All were filled with the Holy Spirit. (Acts. 2:3) Hail Mary...
- 7. They began to express themselves in foreign tongues and make bold proclamation as the Spirit prompted them. (Acts. 2:4) Hail Mary...
- 8. Staying in Jerusalem at the time were devout men of every nation. These heard the sound, and assembled

in a large crowd. They were confused because each heard the disciples speaking in his own language. (Acts. 2:5-6) - Hail Mary...

- 9. Peter stood up with the Eleven and addressed them, "You must reform and be baptized, each one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ, that your sins may be forgiven; then you will receive the Holy Spirit." (Acts. 2: 38)
- Hail Mary...
- 10. Those who accepted his message were baptized; some three thousand

were added that day. (Acts. 2:41)- Hail Mary...

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Meditation on the Joyful Mysteries

The Annunciation – Fruit of Humility

Mary said yes. God was asking a great of her. She could amount disapproval. Joseph could abandon her. She might not be believed. Mary risked a lot because she had faith in God's goodness. I imagine her kneeling in wonderment at the angel Gabriel, his hands encompassing hers, his forehead pressed against hers as he tells her of God's great plan. She whispers "yes" knowing that her life is forever changed and possibly going to be much harder. She allows God's will to be done and with that fiat the salvation of the world is set in motion. I pray that I can put God's will before my own.

The Visitation – Love of Neighbor

Newly pregnant, Mary walks several days to visit her cousin Elizabeth. She is greeted with great joy and exclaims her Magnificat. While knowing that all will call her blessed, she spends several months serving Elizabeth. I imagine her performing the tasks of life so that Elizabeth, in her third trimester when the physical burden of pregnancy is greatest, can rest. Despite her own possible exhaustion and morning sickness, she serves her cousin. I imagine them at the end of the day sitting together and sharing their feelings about these two miraculous babies. I pray that I can serve as Mary did.

The Nativity – Poverty of Spirit

Mary and Joseph are far from home and she is about to give birth. They find nowhere to stay. Rather than panicking, they rely on God who leads them to a safe, warm place for his son's birth. I imagine their worry but also their sense of calm. They know God cares for them and he will not abandon them on this holy journey. As the angels announce Jesus' birth and the shepherds come to pay him homage, Mary and Joseph are

surrounded by God's love. I pray for the grace to depend on God completely.

Presentation in the Temple – Obedience

Mary and Joseph obey the law and bring their new-born son to the temple and offer a sacrifice. There they meet Simeon who has waited many years to meet the Messiah. I imagine Simeon gazing at Jesus. The Christ for whom he has waited has arrived just as God promised. He raises his eyes to heaven in thanks. He also warns Mary that her own heart will be pierced. She continues to trust God, not knowing what lies

ahead. I pray for trust in God's plan and patience in waiting for it to unfold.

Finding Jesus in the Temple – Piety

After not knowing where he was for three days, Mary and Joseph find Jesus in the temple. I imagine the fear they felt when they realized Jesus was not with them as they returned from Jerusalem. I imagine how scared they felt as they looked for him and the increasing anxiety they experience as time passed. At last they find him in his father's home. What relief and joy. We look for Jesus too and we can always find him in church. He is there waiting for us. I pray that I will not find reasons to avoid visiting Jesus regularly.

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Meditation on the Luminous Mysteries

Baptism of Jesus – Openness to the Holy Spirit

Though Jesus is without original sin, John baptizes him and God announces that Jesus is his son and he is pleased. I imagine standing in that cool river, feeling the water rush past me. The sounds of the crowd are muffled as my head goes below the surface. I imagine hearing God's great voice proclaiming he is pleased with his son. I desire God to be pleased with me too, and pray that I can accept the movement of the Holy Spirit in my life.

Wedding at Cana – Jesus Through Mary

It is here Jesus' public life is put into motion. I imagine Mary noticing that the wine is running out and hearing her ask for help, confident in his assistance. His respect for Mary is so high, he performs his first miracle at her request. Her command, "Do whatever he tells you" is for us too. The wine stewards listen and water is turned into wine. When we pray the Rosary she intercedes with her Son on our behalf. I pray to grow closer to Jesus with Mary's help.

Proclamation of the Kingdom – Repentance

Jesus went about the land preaching the coming of the kingdom of heaven. He healed the sick and cast out demons. I imagine the awe of the people watching this man proclaim the importance of repenting of our sins as he healed people of their paralysis or leprosy. He preached about love and forgiveness. We too need healing and repentance. I pray for the ability to be humbly and genuinely sorry for my sins against others and against the God who loves me and made me.

The Transfiguration – Desire for Holiness

Peter, James and John accompany Jesus up Mount Tabor where Jesus is transformed before them in glorious light and Moses and Elijah appear. Peter desires to build tents for them so they may stay. God again proclaims pleasure in Jesus, his beloved Son and tells them to listen to him. I imagine the disciples seeing Jesus with the prophets of the past and hearing God's voice. They received a beautiful gift from God and comforting words from Jesus to not be afraid. I pray for the desire to spend time with Christ thinking about his message and striving for holiness.

Institution of the Eucharist – Eucharistic Adoration

Jesus gives us the greatest of gifts in his presence in the Eucharist—body, blood, soul and divinity. I imagine the disciples hearing these words of the New Covenant and the directive to do this in his remembrance. We reflect on this at every Mass as we genuflect before the tabernacle. We are also invited to visit Jesus in adoration. It takes great faith to believe in the Real Presence. I pray for the grace to have that faith, to seek him in adoration and surrender myself humbly to his service.

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Meditation on the Sorrowful Mysteries

The Agony in the Garden – Conformity to God's Will

Jesus knows torture and death lie ahead and he prays that the cup will pass. He also prays God's will be done. In his agony, he carries the weight of our sins so that we may be saved. I imagine the courage it took to give himself to God's plan. We too suffer and while we may pray the suffering will end, we are given support from Our Lord to endure, as Jesus received strength from the angel in the garden. I pray for the courage to conform to God's will especially when it may be difficult.

The Scourging at the Pillar – Mortification

Jesus is brutally tortured to near death. Scourging was more than mere beating; it involved using instruments to inflict the most pain and blood loss possible without actually killing. Jesus was beaten for our sins. His mother watched as her son's blood spilled on the ground. I imagine the horror she felt watching her precious child be brutalized, and how hard it must have been to not run to his rescue. I pray for forgiveness for my sins, the sins that contributed to the torture of my Lord.

The Crowning with Thorns – Moral Courage

Jesus is stripped, clothed with a scarlet robe and crowned with thorns. He is mocked and spit upon by the soldiers. The people demand his crucifixion. Despite his innocence, he does not defend himself. He is strong in the face of hatred. I imagine his sadness at the people's ignorance, his sorrow at their contempt. I pray for courage to defend God's truth and strength to withstand the criticism and hatred of others.

The Carrying of the Cross – Patience

lesus' humiliation continues as carries the Cross he will be crucified on through the town and people continue to mock him. I imagine the pain of the heavy wood against his back, rubbing against the open wounds from the scourging, the hot sun on him, the thirst, and hunger. I imagine his grief at seeing Mary, knowing she is watching her son die. Jesus is patient in enduring this suffering for us. I pray for more forgiveness, knowing my sins add to the weight of that Cross. I pray for patience in my own times of difficulty.

The Crucifixion – Salvation

Jesus arrives and is nailed to the cross. As he hangs, slowly dying, he is comforted by the presence of Mary, her sister, John and Mary Magdalene. Mary is strong. She has watched him suffer and now die and she never leaves him. I imagine her heartache. In his words to Mary, "Woman, behold, your son" all of us are entrusted to her love. I pray in thanksgiving for Christ's suffering and sacrifice so that I may be saved.

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Meditation on the Glorious Mysteries

The Resurrection – Faith

Jesus did as he foretold; he rose from death, thus securing for us everlasting life in heaven with him and his father. The women who went to visit him are greeted by an angel who gives them this good news. They see him on their way to Galilee and he tells them to tell the disciples of his resurrection. I imagine the joy they feel when they see the one they love living again, the celebration of the disciples and Mary when they are able to touch him and talk to him. I pray for faith that I too may one day be with Jesus in heaven.

The Ascension – Hope

As Jesus ascends to heaven he tells his followers to go and make disciples. He sends them to the world to share his story and he promises he will always be with them. I imagine their surprise to see him lifted up and away to the clouds and their wonderment as all that occurred. I imagine them considering what will happen next and how they will do as he told them. They are filled with hope and maybe fear. I pray for hope when I don't know the way forward or when times seem dark.

The Coming of the Holy Spirit – Wisdom

The apostles and Mary are hiding in the upper room in fear of the future. When the Holy Spirit, the Advocate Jesus said he would send, comes to them they are filled with the gifts they need to go out into the world: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness. goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. We receive these same gifts at our baptism and confirmation. I pray that I can use these gifts to share the love of Jesus and the story of his good news.

The Assumption of Mary – Devotion to Mary

Mary is taken to heaven to her rightful place with Jesus where she intercedes for us in prayer. I imagine her excitement at being with her son again, and her pleasure at being in heaven with God. I pray for her intercession and help in growing closer to Jesus, while asking her to help me love him more. She will keep pointing the way toward her son.

The Coronation of Mary – Eternal Happiness

Mary is the Queen of Heaven and Earth. She listened to God's will and stayed true to his plan for her life. Mary was not spared suffering but her reward in heaven is great. She is our queen too, and if asked she will help us in all facets of our life. I imagine her lovingly looking down at us and her happiness at our requests for help. I pray for her humility, patience, and trust.

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Sr. Lucia's Method for First Saturday Meditation

Sister Lucia says:

"Here is my way of making the meditations on the mysteries of the rosary on the first Saturdays:

First mystery, the Annunciation of the Angel Gabriel to Our Lady.

First prelude: to imagine myself seeing and hearing the Angel greet Our Lady with these words: 'Hail Mary, full of grace.'

Second prelude: I ask Our Lady to infuse into my soul a profound sentiment of humility.

1st point: I will meditate on the manner in which Heaven proclaims that the Most Holy Virgin is full of grace,

blessed among all women and destined to become the Mother of God.

2nd point: The humility of Our Lady, recognizing Herself and declaring Herself to be the handmaid of the Lord.

3rd point: How I must imitate Our Lady, in Her humility, what are the faults of pride and arrogance through which I most often displease the Lord, and the means I must employ to avoid them, etc.

On the second month, I make the meditation on the second joyful mystery. The third month, I make it on the third joyful mystery and so on, following the same method of meditating.

When I have finished the Five First Saturdays, I begin five others and meditate on the sorrowful mysteries, then the glorious ones, and when I have finished them I start over again with the joyful ones."

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Consecration for the Triumphant Victory of the Immaculate Heart of Mary

representative of Christ among us, may this consecration give to him the unity of our hearts, minds and souls to bring the reality of the Triumph of your Immaculate Heart, that it may descend upon the whole earth under his pontificate.

As an apostle of your Triumph, I pledge to you, Mother, to give witness to the divine presence of your Son within the Holy Eucharist, the unifying force of your mighty army. May we find conviction, confidence and a single-minded focus before the Blessed Sacrament. May He create in me a soul of perfection, from me I pray shall His reflection shine forth to all.

O Holy Virgin of Purity, Mediatrix of all heaven's graces, dwell within my heart, bring with you, your Spouse, the Holy Spirit, so that this my consecration will be fruitful through the gifts infused by His coming.

In the power of His presence I shall remain firm in trust, strong and persistent in prayer and flow into total abandonment to God the Father. May the Holy Spirit be manifested as a ripple of pronouncement throughout the world of the union of hearts.
